

REMEMBER HIS WORDS

Some nearly 2000 years ago, a group of mourning Jewish women hurriedly passed through the gates of Jerusalem in the dusky dawn of the first day of the week. They carried spices and fragrant oils they would use to anoint and prepare the body of a young man they had witnessed publicly executed on a cross three days prior. How unfortunate that his beaten, crucified body had laid in the tomb unprepared these past two days. But the women had to observe the Sabbath. Now they would prepare his body and properly lay him to rest.

But as they approached the tomb, they were shocked to find it open. The stone that sealed it had been rolled away! Upon entering the tomb they found that the body they came to prepare was gone! Suddenly two men were standing by them in shining garments.

Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here but is risen! Remember how he spoke to you when he was still in Galilee, saying, 'The son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.'" And they remembered His words (Luke 24:5-8).

It is the old, old story and truly good news to all that hear it. But please notice that when confronted with the empty tomb, it caused these women of old to remember His words.

As you enjoy a hearty lunch with your family...remember His words. As you plan *next* Sunday morning...remember His words.
