Staying Prepared in our Golden Years

So much of our time is focused on the youth of our society. We want to make sure they get the best of everything in life. Within our churches and congregations we seem to follow this same trend with our youth. We provide grade level classes, youth bible studies, and some parents even help to organize special events and camps. This is all done to teach our youth about GOD and to provide them with a Christian environment to be in, so hopefully they will become convicted and develop a strong foundation for the future. The assumption made is that youth is the most critical time in a person's life as it pertains to spirituality. Even though this may be, most biblical examples of righteous men and women who lost their faith is not in their teen or youth years, but rather as an adult, even as older adults.

Solomon, for example, as a young man had just become king and seemed to be following in his father, David's, footsteps. He loved God and kept His commandments.

1 Kings 3:3-5, 3 Now Solomon loved the Lord, walking in the statutes of his father David, except he sacrificed and burned incense on the high places. 4 The king went to Gibeon to sacrifice there, for that was the great high place; Solomon offered a thousand burnt offerings on that altar. 5 In Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream at night; and God said, "Ask what you wish Me to give you."

When GOD asked Solomon what he wanted to be granted to him, his heart seemed to be in the right place. Solomon only asked for wisdom because he felt he was a youth with no experience (1 Kings 3:6-9). This was so impressive to GOD that He not only gave Solomon wisdom but also gave him riches and honor. Solomon, seemingly, "had it all." At this point, Solomon focused his time on building the temple for GOD to dwell and for the Jews to worship. He put all of the resources of Israel and surrounding nations to work building one of the most elaborate temples of its time. Solomon not only had it all but Israel was on top of the world as one of the greatest nations.

Solomon, though being wise, forgot one of the most crucial commands given by GOD to the Israelites: Do not associate nor intermarry with the other nations. (Joshua 23:6-13) The very first wife Solomon took was the King of Egypt, Pharaoh's, daughter. Solomon did not stop there. As he continued to grow older, he had over seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines. Years of influence by these foreign women, ultimately, turned Solomon away from God when he was old. 1 Kings 11:1-11, 1: Now King Solomon loved many foreign women along with the daughter of Pharaoh: Moabite, Ammonite, Edomite, Sidonian, and Hittite women, 2 from the nations concerning which the Lord had said to the sons of Israel, "You shall not associate with them, nor shall they associate with you, for they will surely turn your heart away after their gods." Solomon held fast to these in love. 3 He had seven hundred wives, princesses, and three hundred concubines, and his wives turned his heart away. 4 For when Solomon was old, his wives turned his heart away after other gods; and his heart was not wholly devoted to the Lord his God, as the heart of David his father had been.9 Now the Lord was angry with Solomon because his heart was turned away from the Lord, the God of Israel, who had appeared to him twice, 10 and had commanded him concerning this thing, that he should not go after other gods; but he did not observe what the Lord had commanded. 11 So the Lord said to Solomon, "Because you have done this, and you have not kept My covenant and My statutes, which I have commanded you, I will surely tear the kingdom from you, and will give it to your servant.

Solomon fell away and served other gods, not in his youth, but in his "golden years." It is extremely important for us to learn from this lesson and not to think, "This can't happen to me." This happened to the wisest, smartest man to ever live; the man who "had it all." No matter what age or place we are in life (teen years, adult years, or "golden years") Satan wants us and does not discriminate according to our age.

1 Peter 5:8-9, 8 Be of sober spirit, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. 9 But resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same experiences of suffering are being accomplished by your brethren who are in the world.

Let's be all the more vigilant to not only lay a solid foundation in our youth but also to shore up that foundation into adulthood and our "golden years" so that we may be able to "Stand Firm!" not only in our youth, but for a lifetime (Ephesians 6:10-17).
