**Investment Planning
"Kindness"**

A kind act is a free investment that brings immeasurable dividends. This kind of platitude like statement causes us to nod our heads in agreement. The question is, "What is a kind act?" Consider these answers to that question; a listening ear, a closed mouth in the face of verbal venom, a genuine complement, a gentle smile as you gesture someone forward ahead of you, encouraging another.

"Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath:" (James 1:19 {KJV}). We have often heard it said that God gave us two ears and one mouth because we ought to listen twice as much as we speak. If we look at those we know we can see the wisdom in this thought. Those who listen seem to be wise. "Even a fool who keeps silent is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is deemed intelligent" (Proverbs 17:28 {ESV}). Logic would point us to the idea that those who listen more than they speak are receiving information that helps with calm reasoning. It is interesting when we note that those who have so much to say so often give us little to go on beyond emotional opinion. Could it be that the one who desires to be heard so much has missed the character trait that the one who speaks concisely demonstrates?

The good listener is investing in others rather than his or her own glory. The good listener is often described as kind and comes up in conversation when the personification of kindness is discussed. Could it be that jealousy interrupts the one who desires to be viewed in such a way and the result is verbal, cotton candy. That is, lots of fluff, blown sugar and no substance. Satan is more cunning than we give him credit. He can take someone who honestly wants to be a good listener and turn them into the talker we all avoid. Everyone loses and more seats are reserved in eternal destruction.

One of the ways Satan gets the best of the one who desires to listen is that he appeals to the power card in one's heart. Knowledge is power and we find this idea marketed to young people to encourage them to get as much education as possible. Satan has taken a good thing, education, and used it for his benefit also. When one listens and has facts it is not always necessary to share. However, one who wants to be viewed as a good listener may be sharing facts so everyone will know who knew first. As childish as this sounds it happens even to those with the best of intentions.

A good listener in reality will "THINK" before he or she speaks.

T – Is it TRUTHFUL

H – Is it HELPFUL

I – Is it INSPIRING

N – Is it NECESSARY

K – Is it KIND



It may seem odd that a kind act may be no act at all. A kind act may simply be a closed mouth. If a fact will not help build someone up it most likely does not need to be shared in common conversation with your peers. When another is being unkind, we need not join in. Silence sometimes says much. Let us consider the advice Paul gives concerning our relationships with others.

If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men. Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord. Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good. (Romans 12:18-21, KJV)

Even when someone cuts us off in traffic or cuts in front of us in a check out line, cut them some slack. You may make someone's day by an encouraging smile as you humbly yield to another. You may help another heal by using your words to give a sincere complement. You may inspire another with the simple phrase, "You can do all things through Christ."

Invest in another with a genuine kind act and watch your day produce immeasurable dividends.
