12. Who does Joshua then have a conversation with and what is the subject of the conversation? Why?

1. How many spies does Joshua send into the land and what particular city does he direct them to spy out?
2. Where do the spies lodge?
3. Who was Rahab?
4. What actions does Rahab take when the King of Jericho is looking for the spies?
5. What was Rahab's motivation for helping the spies?
6. How were the spies able to escape and return to the camp?
7. What promise and instruction did the spies give Rahab before they escaped?
8. What message do the spies bring back to Joshua?
9. Where do the people move to at the beginning of chapter 3?

10. What is the instruction that the officers spread through the camp? How far a distance was to be kept between the people and the ark of the covenant?

5. Who appears to Joshua when he is near Jericho? What questions does Joshua ask and what are the answers? What do the answers indicate about who Joshua is talking with?
6. How is Jericho described in Joshua 6:1?
7. What does God tell Joshua in 6:2?
8. How many days were the people to march around Jericho? How many times?
9. Who was to march around the city?

10. Based on the description of verses 8 and 9, how were the people arranged as they marched around Jericho? What was being carried as they marched around the city?

3. How many men does Joshua send up against Ai? What happens?
4. What is the people's reaction? Joshua's?
5. What is God's response to Joshua on why they were defeated?
6. What does God tell Joshua he must do? What would be the consequence if Joshua did not do what God told him to do?
7. How was Achan selected? Describe the conversation between Joshua and Achan. What had Achan taken?
8. What is the punishment for Achan? Was it just Achan?

1. Where are the children of Israel camped? Consider Joshua 8:30-35; Deuteronomy 11:30.
2. Which side of the Jordan is being referenced in 9:1? What are the kings doing?
3. Who is not in this alliance? Locate Gibeon on a map. How far from Gilgal is Gibeon?
4. What do the Gibeonites do in preparation of going to Joshua?
5. What is the answer from the Gibeonites when questioned if they might be from nearby (among us (vs. 7))?
6. God allowed the Israelites to make peace with foreign cities under what conditions (see Deut. 20:10-18)?
7. What is noted in verse 14? And as a result, what does Joshua do in verse 15?
8. How long before the children of Israel discover where the Gibeonites are from? What is the response of the rulers of Israel when they make this discovery?

17. Who forms an alliance at the beginning of chapter 11? Where do they camp? What does God tell Joshua?

18. What was Joshua to do with the chariots and horses?

19. When Hazor was taken, it was burned. Was this the usual thing or not? Which cities have the Israelites burned?


20. What is stated regarding Joshua in 11:15?

22. What particular people did Joshua cut off from the mountains? Where did some of them remain? (11:21-22)

23. What is stated in 11:23 regarding the land?

1. What victories of the children of Israel are reviewed in 12:1-6? Who was the leader of the people for these victories?
2. What lands did these victories give to the Israelites and which tribes claimed the lands?
3. How many kings are listed that Joshua defeated in 12:7-24? Were all the cities taken if the king was defeated?
4. What does God tell Joshua at the beginning of chapter 13?
5. What lands are still to be possessed and how does God direct Joshua to divide the land to the nine and half tribes? Where had the method of dividing the land been stated previously?
6. The distribution of land and the boundaries for the half-tribe of Manasseh, Reuben, and Gad is detailed in 13:8-33. Label the map noting the lands for these tribes.
7. In these lands, who is not driven out?

16. Which allotment is covered in chapter 17? Label it on the map.

17. The tribe of Manasseh were unable to drive out the inhabitants of which cities?


18. What complaint is brought to Joshua by the children of Joseph? What is Joshua's response? Is his answer satisfactory to the people? Why? How does Joshua then respond?
