Though I wish she could have been like Moses (Deuteronomy 34:7) her body began to fail her in her final years and she hadn't been able to be her vibrant loving self. God's design for the Church was well thought out but we know from the New Testament that it doesn't always function like it should. In our Sunday afternoon Bible study we are going through the Bible chronologically and are in Acts. Acts 2:44 is bittersweet for me right now because we can't be together like we want to be. In some ways, though, it makes me appreciate our time together that much more. It also gives us some perspective on how good we actually have it especially compared to what other churches in other parts of the world experience on an ongoing basis.

We are God's remnant here on earth and while we are thankful for our elders leadership and godliness our family is also thankful for ALL of the members of the church here at Folsom. I think that the examples of the early church from Acts 2:42, 46 are repeated here at Folsom. I'm thankful that we don't mirror the example of 1 Cor 1:10-17.

Last week we laid a Proverbs 31 woman to rest. On the day of her funeral Ellie, 5 years old, asked Rachel if her Grandmommy would be at the funeral. It was odd not to have our comforter there in our time of need but we are thankful that our comforter is not gone because the church, as it should, has assumed that role.
