

Do I Really Need to Bother with Revelation?

- God thought we needed it
- Rev 1:3 The book is a blessing
- A message of hope and encouragement
- God promises the overthrow of evil and final victory for the righteous



Why Is Revelation So Hard?

Apocalyptic Style

Apokalupsis = an unveiling (Rev. 1:1)

 "The title implies the purpose of the writer was to make his message increasingly vivid by the "unveiling" through signs and symbols" (Robert Harkrider)

• Distinct from parables, but requires a similar effort to understand

Apocalyptic Books in the Bible

- Daniel
- Ezekiel
- Zechariah
- Revelation

Note: Daniel, Ezekiel, and Zechariah were all fulfilled as they were prophesied - reinforcement



Apocalyptic Literature

- Symbolism used to introduce a concept
- Example Throne scenes (Ezek. 1, Isa. 6, Rev. 4)
- Communicated in a vision
- Often an angel is present to interpret the vision or dream – the angel is a "tour guide"
- Angel explains the extraordinary things the writer is seeing



Why Did God Use Apocalyptic Literature?

- To conceal a message that could be considered treason (?)
- To explain the spiritual realm to mortals (e.g., throne scenes)
- To acknowledge that the enemies of God's people can be scary
- To describe the intervention of God in a way we can picture
- To assure us that God will prevail

Answers Big Questions

• Is my faith worth the suffering I have to endure?

• Is there any hope for the future?

• Will God intervene?



Three Suggestions for Apocalyptic Literature

1. Picture – read, visualize You can't skip the picture and get the message.



2. Principle – what is the point of the vision?



3. Practice –application for the immediate audience (e.g., the seven churches of Asia), then the abiding application
