I have 3 stories for you about 3 families that we are helping this winter in villages near Kremenchuk. Artur sends these reports so you can see some of the work we are doing. The 3 pictures are in opposite order of the stories.

The wonderful news is that the Sunset International Bible Institute (SIBI) has agreed for us to partner with them and they will be assisting us with refugee funds as we press on in this work for the future!

It is so critical that you who have continued to support us on a monthly basis, please continue to do so. ALL refugee money goes to the people we are helping. The regular monthly support allows us to continue to meet our monthly needs without taking away from the refugee funds.

THE STORIES

A family from Kupyansk. Their son is a policeman. When the Russians found out about it, they destroyed their house. The couple miraculously survived. They live in the Kremenchuk district in a country house with stove heating.

Mother Natalia with her disabled son Valery. They are from Kharkiv, from Saltivka, where the occupiers were shelling around the clock. They were left without a roof, electricity, water and gas... Volunteers helped them leave. Now they live in Rokytny in a house with stove heating.

This family consists of 5 people, they are from Kupyansk. The daughter is a doctor, worked in the ambulance service and lived and worked with the wounded in the hospital for the first week of the war. There were many wounded and disabled in explosions and fires.... A rocket hit their house in March. The house was destroyed, the parents and son escaped by sitting in the cellar... They left the occupation with great obstacles at roadblocks. The Russians abused and robbed the refugees at every post.

They live in a small house with stove heating in a garden society outside the city. Thanks to the support of the Church of Christ, people were fully provided with blankets, pillows, bed linen, clothes, shoes, dishes and, most importantly, firewood. Now, for the first time, it will be warm in temporary homes.
