# REDEMPTION

Luke 1.68

- A familiar concept in Scripture — Leviticus 25.47ff
  - Master, Slave, Redeemer, Price, Freedom
- Zacharias prophesied of the redeeming Christ - Luke 1.68-79
  - Master — sin (77)
  - Slave — the sinner (77)
  - Redeemer — Son of David (69) and Abraham (73)
  - Freedom — from sin (77) and for peace (79)
  - Price — Luke 2.35; 9.23,31

# REMISSION

Acts 2.38

- Again, a familiar concept — Deuteronomy 15.1-10 (Lev. 25.1-6).
  - The debt was **sent away** for the year — it was not to be pursued or required.
- Speaking to Jews, Peter borrowed this Hebrew concept to express a greater reality in Christ.
  - Sins, rather than being remembered yearly, could be sent away — and not just for a year!
  - Sins would be sent away by the authority of Christ (cf. Hebrews 10.16-18).

# REFRESHING

Acts 3.19

- A word more familiar in thought than in usage.
  - Literally “to cool again” — related to 2 Timothy 1.16
- Follow Peter’s reasoning in context:
  - “Repent and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins...”
  - “Repent therefore and be converted that your sins may be blotted out...”
  - The result of responding to Christ — refreshing.
  - Note the comprehensive nature of salvation in Christ!
