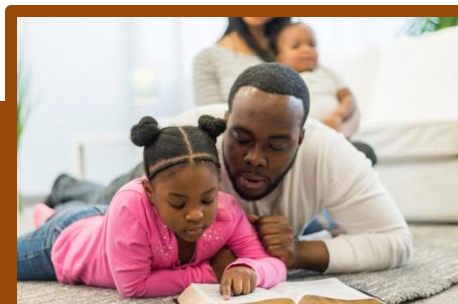
READING OBJECTIVE
