- A. David interrupts what he sees with the One he is building his life upon.
- B. What do you believe?

III. _____ (*Psalm 3:4-5*)

- A. David recalls the many victories of the past that have come from God’s hand.
- B. What do you remember?

IV. _____ (*Psalm 3:6*)

- A. David considers the evidence of his circumstances and makes a decision.
- B. What did you decide this morning?

V. _____ (*Psalm 3:7*)

- A. David makes two requests of God.
- B. What are your prayer requests today?

VI. _____ (*Psalm 3:8*)

- A. David ends his prayer with a proclamation of assurance.
- B. Who will you let salvation and praise belong to today?
