Where Are the Dead?

What Happens After We Die? (2)

Scripture Reading: Matthew 22:23-33

Introduction:

- A. Remember our prayer for this study: "O LORD, make me know my end..." (Psa 39:4).
- B. Death is not the end of our existence; our spirits will return to God (*Ecclesiastes 12:1-7*).
- C. Physical death is simply the separation of our bodies from our spirits (*James 2:14-17,26*).
- D. But what happens after this separation? What happens after physical death?

I. Jesus' parable of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31) provides valuable insight

- A. Jesus wasn't in the habit of basing his parables on unrealistic foundations. He implies:
 - 1. There is a conscious, personal aspect to life after death.
 - 2. In this future realm, the identity of self is preserved.
 - 3. Wherever the dead are, there is a separation between the evil and the good.
 - 4. The dead are experiencing what they are experiencing based on the exit ramp they took.
- B. Jesus used a term with rich Biblical background to describe this abode of the dead—*Hades*.

II. "The realm of the dead"

- A. The Hebrew equivalent to *Hades—Sheol—*is used 64 times in the Old Testament.
 - 1. *Genesis* 37:34-35 Jacob, as he laments the reported death of his son, Joseph.
 - 2. *Psalm* 89:46-48 Ethan the Ezrahite, on the difficulties of earthly life.
 - 3. Psalm 139:7-8 David, on the omnipresence of God.
 - 4. *Proverbs* 7:24-27 Solomon, providing a warning against the sin of adultery.
- B. The New Testament uses *Hades* (Greek) 10 times to describe this realm of the dead.
 - 1. *Matthew 16:18* the gates of Hades will not prevail against Christ's church.
 - 2. Acts 2:22-32 Peter, contrasting King David with Jesus of Nazareth.
 - 3. Revelation 1:17-18 the glorified Christ has the keys of Death and Hades.

III. "He is not God of the dead, but of the living"

- A. In *Matthew* 22:23-33, Jesus makes clear that there will be a resurrection of all the dead.
- B. In *Matthew 25:31-46*, Jesus clearly reveals the ultimate point of the coming resurrection.
- C. In Revelation 20:11-15, we are told that Hades will eventually give up the dead who are in it.
- D. Why? 2 Corinthians 5:10 and Romans 14:11-12 provide God's answer.
- E. Regardless of the exit ramps taken from this life, all roads will converge at God's throne!

Conclusion:

"Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade others." (2 Corinthians 5:11)
