As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men—Galatians 6:10

She poured her heart and soul out to the Lord genuinely in her distress. She didn't run away from God, but towards God! She was faithful and consistent despite her uncomfortable circumstances. And when the Lord decided to grant her request, she dedicated her new baby boy, Samuel, to the Lord for service. Samuel would become a very influential figure in Israel's history.

One of the things I still tear up over to this day is how my Mom intentionally poured into me at such a young age. I'm not sure if it was because I was the firstborn, or because it was the first time that she felt that great weight of responsibility for a tiny person's life. Mom would read to me when I was little—she taught me the books of the Bible, memory verses, whether it was in the bed or the bathtub! I still can sing memory verses to the tunes that she taught me. I wonder if these early encounters with Scripture were a type of foreshadowing of how the Lord would lead me to Northeast Arkansas, and now with you all in Monticello expounding the very same Scripture. For these reasons and reflections, I must admit that I am no parent, yet I have been impacted by my own parents and grandparents' examples. Parents, how are you pouring into your kids the most important news they'll ever hear? How are you impacting your children for eternity?

While we are honoring our Mother Figures today, we would be missing an even greater point if we didn't take proper time to honor our Lord in worship, service, and fellowship. Let's tune our hearts to sing His praise together. It's a tremendous blessing to be here, serving alongside you all in the Kingdom. Have a great week...Blessings!
