Now that that is done, I hope you all are well. I hope you brethren who have struggled with the hurricanes this year are seeing the light at the end of the tunnel as far as recovery is concerned. I missed sending a report in October because I went to Philly for 1 ½ weeks, and then went to Maine to preach in a lectureship.

I told last time about some in the prison who have fallen away, and several people thought I was discouraged. Far from it. This is the most exciting work that I've had a part in all my life. Souls who are asking if they can come to my studies. And seeing the gospel transform them into true followers. I am sad some leave the Faith, but the Lord in the parable of the sower said that would definitely happen. I am just excited to see those "walking in the truth" after they have been tested.

William Harrison was brought to the Tuesday class by Sam about 6 months ago. Sam said, "This guy has anger issues, but I think you can work with him." He didn't seem at all interested the first time. About 2 weeks later he participated. A month after that he is defending the truth with scriptures he has learned. He wants the addresses of churches up in Texarkana, because that's where he is paroling out to. Now 6 months down the road he wants to be baptized! How powerful is the gospel! I told him to turn in an I-60 and we'll get him baptized as soon as we can.

There are about 30 in my Hebrews class. Some know their Bible well. We talked a lot today about how we must obey Jesus to be saved (Heb 5:9). When we first started there were serious objections and challenges, and over the next 2 or 3 weeks about 10 left the study. No one raised an objection today. The class is made up of Baptists, Catholics, Pentecostals, one Mormon, and about 9 brethren. The truth is being proclaimed.

The class Tuesday morning at the prison is studying Robert Harkrider's Basic Bible Doctrines book. It is mostly made up of about 10 brethren and 5 others. It is a great class

The work in Corrigan goes well. We finished Romans and are now studying Proverbs. The meetup class we still have at the Texas Burger, but only one non-Christian has joined us for a study. The meetup works great in larger cities, but not too well where there are about 1500 people. I know my son in Philly and others have great success with it. We still do the weekly newspaper article, and will perhaps try something different when the new year comes.

My support remains steady and sufficient. Thank you brethren for your great concern for the lost, and your concern that they hear the gospel. Thanks for your support and encouragement.
