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  - 3. The Christian understands the place of the Old Testament! It was fulfilled and bore witness of the New Covenant. (Heb 10:9-10)
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  - 1. The leaders of Jesus day left the heart untouched. His disciples were not to be like them. (Mt 5:20; Mt 23:23)
  - 2. We cannot excuse what God despises. (Gal 5:19-21; 1 Jn 3:15)
  - 3. How many hide bitterness in their hearts and think they are living as a disciple of God? (Lev 19:17-18; Prov 22:24-25)
  - 4. What does our words say about our hearts? (Jude 9)
- C. A disciple <u>carefully loves His mate and protects their marriage</u>. (Mt 5:27-32)
  - 1. God's marriage law must be strictly taught and followed.
  - 2. The spirit of lawlessness seeks compromise and man approved "loopholes."
  - 3. A disciple's marriage will reflect the character of God! (Mk 10:45: Eph 5:25)
  - 4. What does a disciple do when disagreements come within marriage?
- D. A disciple seeks to be completely honest in all things. (Mt 5:33-37)
  - 1. Why do people swear? Many use it to deceive!
  - 2. There are many ways to lie! Telling the truth may be hard but it will yield God's fruit over time.
  - 3. Lies will lead to a change of character and a loss of honest thinking. In time we will lie to ourselves and then be in darkness. (2 Thess 2:10-12)
  - 4. The biggest lies are the ones we tell ourselves. (Gal 6:7-8)
- E. A disciple <u>seeks to unselfishly serve all men</u>. (Mt 5:38-48)
  - 1. How can I know what is really in my heart? Look at your associations.
  - 2. When God's ways are truly first, then we will do things and make sacrifices that others would think are crazy!
  - 3. What happens when we truly care for and pray for those that are our enemies?
  - 4. How we handle our hurts will show how we have grown as true disciples of Jesus! (1 Pt 2:23)
  - 5. Are we isolated judges looking down on the weaknesses of others, or are we servants of those in need?
  - 6. If you are often isolated and angry at sinners perhaps you should honestly look at yourself. (Lk 18:9-14)
