2. Mark 11:15-19. How were the people making the temple a "Robbers' den"? Was it wrong to sell animals for sacrifices in the temple?

3. Jesus shows His displeasure with the situation at the temple. What application(s), if any, can we make to God's desire for us following His will in the local church?

4. Why were the chief priests and scribes seeking to destroy Jesus? Why did they not do so at this time?

5. Mark 11:12-14, 20-26. Is this a miracle that Jesus performs on the fig tree? Why or why not?

6. What is the purpose/result of miracles Jesus performs? What is the purpose of the situation with the fig tree?

7. Is it true that if you have faith and pray to move a mountain, it will move? What are the specifics of this situation? Who is Jesus talking to? What application would be specific to them?
8. Mark 11:25-26. How does these verses apply to us today?
9. Mark 11:27-33. Why did Jesus not tell them by what authority He was doing these things?
10. Mark 12:1-12. What is the application of the parable? Who was the focus of the parable and how do you know? How was the parable received?
11. Mark 12:13-17. How were the Pharisees and Herodians testing Jesus? What was the result?
12. Mark 12:18-27. How were the Sadducees questioning Jesus? What was the result?
13. Mark 12:28-34. How did the scribe question Jesus? What was the result?
14. Explain the statement Jesus makes about the scribe: "You are not far from the kingdom of God".
15. Mark 12:35-37. Who is the Son of David? How could the Christ be called the Son of David?
