1. Outline Mark 13.

2. Mark 12:38-40. Jesus warns to “beware of the scribes”. What is He warning them about? What, if any, is an application for us today derived from this warning?

3. Explain how the warning in James 3:1 relates to the statement Jesus makes here in regard to the scribes.

4. Mark 12:41-44. What was Jesus observing in v.41? Apply this to our giving, what should He be “observing” in us?

5. Does Jesus expect us to contribute all we own?

6. Most of us give out of our “surplus” or “abundance”. What are some dangers associated with this? (Consider Malachi 1:4; Isaiah 1:10-17; Matthew 23:23, 24; Phillipians 4:18)

7. Mark 13:1-11. Jesus here tells of the coming destruction of the temple. When was the temple destroyed (both prior to this time and in the future of which Jesus is foretelling)?
8. Is this section telling of the destruction of the earth? What indications in the text give clarity to the event Jesus is describing?
9. Mark 13:14-29. What is the "abomination of desolation"? Where is it spoken of in scripture?
10. What are some of the events described as going to happen in v.24-27? Consider Isaiah 13:9-11, 19:1; 51:6; 1 Thessalonians 4:17
11. Read the following verses and indicate what the "coming" in each is:

 - B. John 14:3, 28
 - C. Mark 9:1; Matthew 16:27-28
 - D. Revelation 3:20
 - E. James 5:7
 - F. Mark 13
