Name the Person or People (From Acts 1-6)

1. Chosen as an apostle to replace Judas (1:23-26).
2. Opponents were not able to resist the wisdom and the Spirit by which he spoke (6:8-10).
3. One in the council who advised they leave the apostles alone (5:34-39).
4. Perceived by the council to be uneducated and untrained men (4:13).
5. Satan filled this man's heart (5:3).
6. Disturbed that the apostles were preaching in Jesus the resurrection from the dead (4:1-2).
