Six Things to Be or Do

I must be a good leader, because after all, God did put me in charge of my home (1 Timothy 3:4-5, 12; Genesis 18:19; Joshua 24:15; Isaiah 40:10-11).

And to be a good leader, I must do or be the following things...

I must show courage, strength, conviction, and endurance (1 Corinthians 16:13; 1 Corinthians 15:58).

I must be an effective communicator (examples of Ezra and Nehemiah; Genesis 18:19; Proverbs 25:11).

I must open my heart; I must openly express my love (2 Corinthians 6:11-13; Philippians 1:8; Proverbs 31:29; 1 John 3:16-18).

I must be a good provider—no such thing as a lazy leader (2 Thessalonians 3:7-12; Psalms 128:2).

I must be a good protector (yes, from physical harm, but more emphasis on protection from spiritual harm: 2 John 1:6-11; Titus 1:9-11).

Duties of Husbands and Wives Toward Each Other

Husbands, love your wives as Christ loved the church (Ephesians 5:25).

Wives, respect your husbands, submit to them and obey them (Ephesians 5:22, 24, 33; Titus 2:5).

Look out for each other's needs (Philippians 2:4), which means you'll have to pay close attention to each other.

“Be kindly affectionate to one another” (Romans 12:10).

“Fervently love one another from the heart” (1 Pet. 1:22).

Be tenderhearted (Ephesians 4:32), patient (1 Thessalonians 5:14), courteous (1 Pet. 3:8), and forgiving (Eph. 4:32).

Praise each other (Proverbs 31:28).

Make a “covenant” with your eyes, as Job did, that you will not look upon another man or woman (Job 31:1).

Don't let the sun go down on your wrath; work your problems out before they fester and lead to even greater problems (Ephesians 4:26).

Labor together in the kingdom of the Lord, just like Aquila and Priscilla did (Acts 18:26; Rom. 16:3; 1 Cor. 16:19).

Do these good things for each other as long as you live (Proverbs 31:12).
