Teach me Your paths.


⁵ Lead me in Your truth and teach me,

For You *are* the God of my salvation;




Teach me Lord
to wait
(Psalm 25:1-5)

-

- Waiting involves **complete sacrifice** (:1)
 - In David's time of waiting he did not turn in on himself, turn out against others, but turned to God
 - This is why he could rejoice even when he was the most uncertain (Ps 86:4)

- 
- Waiting involves **complete sacrifice** (:1)
 - Waiting involves **confident trust** (:2-3)
 - Trust is dependent on the character of the one in whom the trust is being placed.
 - God's accounting is different than ours
 - *"Let no one who waits on You be ashamed"*
(c.f. Luke 9:26)

Teach me Lord
to wait
(Psalm 25:1-5)

- 
- Waiting involves **complete sacrifice** (:1)
 - Waiting involves **confident trust** (:2-3)
 - Waiting involves **continued endurance** (:4-5)
 - We need to “wait actively”
 - Not “observation” as we normally conceive it (Hosea 12:6)
 - Yet, we must allow Him to act where we cannot (Is. 64:4; Ps. 62:1-2)
 - The psalmist waits with “Your truth” (25:5)

For we were saved in this hope, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, **we eagerly wait for it** with perseverance.

Romans 8:24-25

For our citizenship is in heaven, from which **we also eagerly wait** for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself.. Therefore, my beloved and longed-for brethren, my joy and crown, so stand fast in the Lord, beloved.
