## 1 Corinthians, Lesson One, ch. 1:1-17 Questions

1.	Besides "church of Christ" are there other acceptable names for Gods people in a local congregation? Can you name others?
2.	In His letter, Paul refers to those in Corinth as "brethren" as well as "saints". With all the strife, division, in-fighting, and disagreements – often leading to bitterness or worse, Paul still calls them brethren. What should this tell us about those with whom disagree or find in flagrant sin? Do their motives have much to do with our disposition?
3.	In 1:10 we see the phrase "same" or "one" mind. Does this mean that all members must agree on everything? If not, how do we know what we must agree on and what is matter of opinion?
4.	Why would some of the christians choose to identify with mere men rather than Christ?
5.	Why do you suppose Paul introduces the letter expressing his credentials? Didn't they already know who Paul was?
6.	How does Paul identify the church members?
7.	When Paul says that Christ did not send him to baptize, is he saying that Christ is not requiring baptism in His church? If not, what does this phrase mean?
