The View for January 2012

As I write this, another tractor trailer has run into the low clearance of Metro North tracks over River Street. What used to be an occasional event has become regular. It really helps to know where you are going, and have a clear path to your destination. Isaiah's Advent cry, 'make straight in the desert a highway for our God', rings true for followers as well as drivers.

Ahead of us is the birthday of this Congregation. January 11, 2012 marks the 248th anniversary of the founding of the Episcopal Society of Milford. Two years to go to our Sestercentennial. (In Latin the number 2½ is expressed as "half-three". "Sestertius" is a contraction of semis (halfway) tertius (third) - hence Sestercentennial).

What are the signposts on the highway we travel? What do you see? I have a few ideas that energize me and would like to share them as we begin this New Year and close in on our Sestercentennial.

1. We need to revisit what has happened since Jesse Osmun's arrest this past August and the charges and counter charges made at the Diocesan led meeting of August 11, to present the facts, to acknowledge our brokenness, to find healing and closure so that we can move forward.
2. When I look at the strength and solidity of our physical building – I get excited as I see the inner spiritual strength of the community continue to grow so that we are as strong inwardly, in our faith, in our formation, as we are outwardly. Living into our Purpose is the way to realize this goal.
3. This community of faith needs to be able to speak not just to those who know how to open and read a letter (me) – but needs to communicate across all the platforms of the culture of our congregation – teens, twenties, young parents all the way up to the luddites among us. We, dare I say it, must compete in the marketplace for the souls of our kids, and the generations yet to be born.
4. We are trained to consider what happens at St. Peter's from the perspective of "I like it, I am comfortable with it, and therefore it is good." We will need to pledge our time and resources to continue to recreate the way we do things, not just maintain the way we have always done them. In this way the generations coming will be able to drink the same spiritual water we have.
5. God's call to mission and ministry invites us to thoughtfully expand our mission endeavors while equipping our ministers (you) to do so. A constantly expanding emphasis on mission will balance the focus of maintenance.

What do you think? There are some obstacles in the way. We won't get it all done tomorrow. Yet I believe that since it is God who has called us, we can trust that God will not fail us as we obey that call.

Report from the Treasurer: November, 2011

Income Year-to-Date	\$252,317.92
Expenses Year-to-Date	<u>(257,901.09)</u>
Current Deficit	(5,583.17)

Our income this month was \$4,000 more than average. This helped us reduce some of our operating deficit.

Overall our expenses have been greater than our income. We have increased costs in maintaining the church buildings in addition to the increase in the utilities.

To ensure the deductibility of your church contributions, please do not file your 2011 income tax return until you have received a written acknowledgment of your contributions from the church. Some of your contributions may not be tax-deductible if you file your tax return before receiving a written acknowledgment of your contributions from the church.

Abandon Your Old Wineskins Before 2012

“No one pours new wine into old wineskins. Otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and both the wine and the wineskins will be ruined. No, they pour new wine into new wineskins.” (Mark 2:22 NIV)

Near my house is a gas station/convenience store that just underwent a makeover, changing their utilitarian look into a warm and inviting neighborhood haven, something like a coffee bar with gas pumps.

When I walked into the place, however, it appeared the employees missed the makeover memo. The kid behind the counter wore a new uniform that matched the new look, but he still wore the same sullen expression from before, perhaps a little bored and a bit put out that an actual customer had walked in to disturb him.

It made me think about how we try to put new wine into old wineskins. Jesus says we’re doomed to failure because “the wine will burst the skins, and both the wine and the wineskins will be ruined” (Mark 2:22 NIV).

For you to become the person God wants you to be in 2012, you will have to abandon the old wineskins in your life so that God can pour himself into the wineskin of your new life-in-Christ.

This may mean, for instance, that we cannot try to pour the new wine of “honesty at work” into an old wineskin of “cutting corners.” Otherwise, “both the wine and the wineskins will be ruined.”

This year, you will have to change in order to be the person God wants you to be. Are you ready to make the changes? Do you feel the excitement of knowing God is right there with you, not just helping you change, but leading you in the change?
