It is my hope that the Lord will be using us as an instrument of healing for others even as he is bringing healing to the individuals within the parish family. The Lord has already done so much in your lives to draw you to himself, I know he has great plans for the future of St. Peter's as he moves us forward together in his ministry.

The boxes go all over the world to children, who may NEVER have received a gift. They learn of God's love for them and receive a New Testament. After 12 weeks of Bible study, many are baptized, bringing their parents to Christ. What a wonderful way to fulfill our Purpose Statement!

Please shop with your children so they can feel the joy of giving to another child. You can pack your own shoe boxes, or come to our day of assembling the boxes on WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 14th, at 10 a.m. It will be a great morning of fun and fellowship, and those who wish could attend the Holy Eucharist at noon in the chapel to say special prayers for the children who will receive the boxes. Bring a bagged lunch. Below is a list of items needed.

Have you met Linda Gustafson

You may have seen her on the altar serving as an acolyte. She is also a crucifer at funerals and burials and brings Holy Communion to shut-ins. She loves the Episcopal Church and enjoys participating in our services. Linda especially likes that we govern our church, choose our priest, and have a good sense of being a caring community. When she first came to St. Peter's, Linda's mentors were Alan Jepson and the late Betty Jepson. Linda has served on the Vestry and was St. Peter's treasurer for six years. Whenever we have our church breakfasts, Linda can be spotted as a member of the cooking crew, working with people with whom she has formed deep relationships.

Linda was born in Bridgeport and is of Slovak origin. She has a brother who resides in California. She grew up in the Carpatho Russian Orthodox Church until she married John Gustafson and was received into the Episcopal Church.



Family is very important to Linda and she fondly reminisces about Sunday dinner with the family all together. Prayer was always said at meals. Special customs were followed on Christmas Eve. Straw was placed under the table to remind everyone that Christ was born in a stable, all animals in the household were fed first, and one door was left ajar so that a stranger, who might be our Lord, could join in the celebration. Often there were guests at the table. Salt and pepper were not allowed on the table because they symbolized harshness and bitterness. Honey on the table represented sweetness and a small piece of garlic would be dipped in honey and eaten. The garlic represented the harshness of life and the honey overtakes it with life's sweetness and goodness. After partaking of meatless meals featuring pierogi, mushrooms from Slovakia, and seafood dishes, everyone would sing Christmas carols. It was a joyous time!

Linda has had a very varied working life. She worked in retail, was a department manager at Macy's, worked in construction, and, in the middle of this, she found time to go on to the University of Bridgeport where she earned a degree in Business with minors in Economics and Personnel.

After college, Linda worked as a customer service representative, pricing specialist at Athome Furniture and worked at Sikorsky for 10 years as a member of a 3-person team supplying replacement parts for downed aircraft.

Linda is also a Justice of the Peace in CT. To date she has performed 148 marriages in CT, MA and Mexico. She is active with the Milford Lions serving on their Executive Board and as a Zone for six clubs in New Haven County. Her passion is to serve with the Lions Low Vision Chapters as a speaker for Low Vision, a group that informs people with low vision of the many tools and aids that will assist them so that they may maintain an independent life while dealing with diminishing vision.

Linda is one busy lady! We are happy to have her here at St. Peter's.

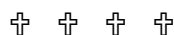
