In our prayers of the people this fall we have been making a point of praising God and giving thanks to him before we turn to our prayers of supplication, or asking for our needs to be met. This development of an attitude of gratitude has a wonderfully positive impact on our lives, in our relationships with others, and even in our physical health. This month at St. Peter's our focus will be on recognizing God's grace in our lives, responding in our hearts with gratitude, and reacting with

It is my hope that the ministry of St. Peter's will have this impact and will provide opportunities for the members of the parish to have this impact in the world. Working together for the glory of God we are able to accomplish this. His Holy Spirit not only multiplies our efforts but raises them exponentially. He takes what we are able to offer, even when it seems like it can hardly make a difference in the face of such need, and uses our faithfulness to accomplish miracles through his power at work in the world.

Morning Bible Study on Tuesday at 7:00 a.m. in the church library.

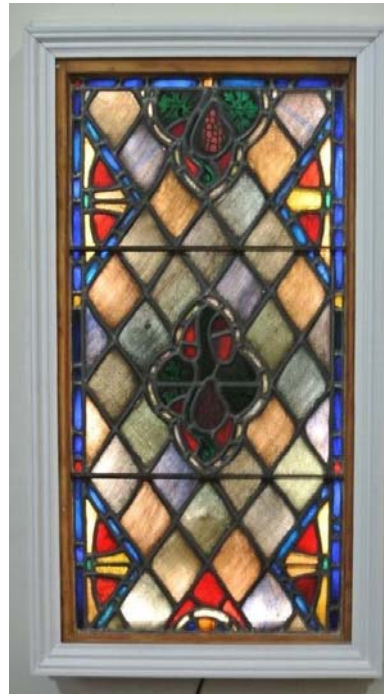

LEMs To Offer Evening Prayer During Advent

Do the Christmas/New Year holidays bring on too much stress for you? You can alleviate some of that stress and bring yourself closer to the true meaning of Christmas by attending Evening Prayer in the St. Peter's Chapel at 6 p.m. Monday through Friday during Advent.

Evening Prayer, a liturgy found in the Book of Common Prayer for late afternoon or early evening which can be led by a layperson, will begin Monday, Dec. 2 and continue Monday through Friday through the first three weeks of December and then conclude on Monday Dec. 23rd

The service, which runs about 30 minutes, offers a superb meditative way to "let go" of the day's burdens and frustrations while also celebrating the day's joys. Each day's service will be led by a Lay Eucharistic Minister or a layperson. You do not have to attend every day, although that could be a beneficial Advent discipline.

The service will offer the Book of Common Prayer liturgy as well as an Evening Service from the New Zealand Book of Common Prayer. So join us and

discover quiet relief from what can easily become, unfortunately, the madness of the Christmas holidays.

Commitment Campaign Kicks Off

The 2013 Commitment Campaign is officially under way and the committee overseeing the campaign asks that all members of the parish read the packet of materials they received in late October and prayerfully consider how they can contribute to the parish, both monetarily and as a volunteer.

The package includes a letter from our Priest-in-Charge Cynthia Knapp discussing her own experience in proportional giving as a missionary in Japan after graduating from college. There is a letter from the lay members of the committee explaining St. Peter's financial situation and the need to increase our monetary pledges. Also you will find a sheet listing some of the parish "successes" during the past year as well as showing the income and expenses of the parish. There is also a folder explaining e-Giving, and a Commitment Form for making your monetary commitment for 2014.

Please bring your commitment card to the Nov. 24 Sunday services when we will celebrate your commitment to St. Peter's as we approach our 250th Anniversary Year. If you cannot attend the Nov. 24 services, please mail your commitment card to the church no later than Nov. 20 or place it in the offering plate before the Nov. 24 services.

As the committee points out in the package, St. Peter's is currently operating on a budget that includes a built-in deficit with several large expenditures falling due in the last two months of this calendar year.

The committee asks that you recognize God's grace in your life and respond in your heart with gratitude and react with generosity, keeping in mind that all we have is a gift from God and proportional giving is a way of giving back to God the first fruits of our labor in recognition of that.

No doubt, many families are still wrestling with their own challenges in this difficult economy. But prayerfully consider your commitment to St. Peter's as the parish seeks to respond to the needs of so many who are struggling both financially and spiritually. Take to heart the apt words of St. Paul in his Letter to the Ephesians (2:10): For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to devote ourselves to the good deeds for which Christ has designed us."

St. Nicholas to Visit Parish on Dec. 7

The Bishop of Myra, better known to all of us as St. Nicholas, will make his annual visit to St. Peter's at a special potluck supper in Clemence Memorial Parish Hall on Dec. 7. The time will be announced, but mark the date on your calendar now.

His visit to St. Peter's will fall the day after his birth date so we'll also be celebrating that historic event and perhaps can convince the ancient saint to tell us more stories about his life. All in the parish are invited to the potluck, although St. Nicholas is especially eager to meet with the very young people of the parish.

His visit will also include the singing of traditional Christmas carols and perhaps some other musical high jinks as well as a reading of "The Night Before Christmas." As we get closer to the Dec. 7 visit, the host committee for the visit will post sign-up sheets on what to bring to the potluck.

St. Nicholas' visit offers a different perspective on the upcoming Christmas holiday, so please make sure your young ones attend. Who knows, everyone may even depart after St. Nicholas' visit with a gold coin in their pocket!

St. Peter's Christmas Pageant will be held on Sunday, December 22nd. We are in need of seamstresses to fill in the gaps in the costumes wardrobe.

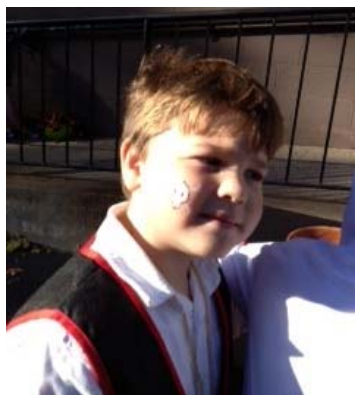

Give What You Get

“God, who supplies seed for the sower and bread to eat, will also supply you with all the seed you need and will make it grow and produce a rich harvest from your generosity. He will always make you rich enough to be generous at all times, so that many will thank God for your gifts which they receive from us. For this service you perform not only meets the needs of God’s people, but also produces an outpouring of gratitude to God.” (2 Corinthians 9:10-12 TEV)

What God gives to me he wants to give through me.

God is looking for people that he can bless the world with. He looks around and asks, “Will you be a cup, or will you be a straw?” If you’re a cup, you just get filled up, and that’s it. But if you’ll say, “God, I’ll be a straw, and you can channel your blessing through me to other people,” then that’s the kind of person God wants to bless.

The Bible says in 2 Corinthians 9:10-11, “*God, who supplies seed for the sower and bread to eat, will also supply you with all the seed you need and will make it grow and produce a rich harvest from your generosity. He will always make you rich enough to be generous at all times*” (TEV).

This promise is built on your willingness to share what he supplies to you. Are you willing to pass on the blessing to others that God blesses you with?

You may say, “Wait a minute! I’m not rich enough to be generous.” Oh, yes you are! No matter how much you’ve got, you can be generous. There’s a story about a woman in the Bible who only had two pennies, yet she gave them away. You can always give something. It’s a myth that “I don’t have enough to give.” You can always give something. In fact, you *have* to give something, because God is testing you. Verse 12 says, “*For this service you perform not only meets the needs of God’s people, but also produces an outpouring of gratitude to God.*”

When you’re going through a tough time, and you say, “God, I don’t have much, but whatever I’ve got, I’m willing to share. I’ve only got a little food here, but I’m willing to invite somebody over for dinner. I’m willing to share whatever I’ve got.” God promises to do three things for you: First, you will grow spiritually. Second, other people’s needs will be met. And third, God is praised.

When you give whatever you have, God will open the door of blessing in your life like you cannot believe.

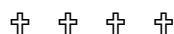

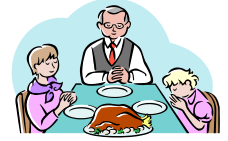
