Redeeming the time Definite portion of time; season; opportunity.

- 1. THE time: each moment gives opportunity for some work.
- 2. The <u>TIME</u> (sg.): as if our whole life is an opportunity.

'Americans have more time-saving devices and less time than any other people in the world!'

Redeeming the time

Lay hold of, understand special significance of life as a whole; attitude toward circumstances.

- 1. Must buy, exchange something for it.
- 2. Merchant knows value of item; buys it at best time (opportunity). Costs him time and effort.
